What should I bring to camp?

You must bring to camp your Bible, medical form- *notarized*, participant form, flexible and positive attitude, linens (washcloth, towel, pillow, sleeping bag and/or sheets & blanket), hygiene items and tennis shoes.

Other suggested items include the following: extra tennis shoes in case it rains, shower flip flops, bathing suit/swim trunks and towel (girls and ladies swimwear should be modest and must fully cover midriff or a dark t-shirt will be worn over the suit and should wear a cover-up to and from pool), at least one pair of shorts/shirt that can get real dirty, offering for special missionary support, additional spending money for soda and treats, sunscreen, bug spray, raingear, snacks, flashlight, music tracks or instruments for worship special music and celebration service and contemporary Christian CD's that will be given to your counselor to play and share during appropriate times.
